Rev Fred Nile Successfully Moves Historic Assyrian Homeland Motion

On Wednesday 19 March 2014, The Rev Hon Fred Nile successfully moved the historical Assyrian Homeland Motion which was passed unanimously by all political parties Liberal, National Party, Christian Democratic Party, Greens, ALP and Shooters and Fishers Party.

ASSYRIAN AUTONOMOUS PROVINCE MOTION

1. That this House considers and supports a resolution by the Australian Assyrians that demands the Iraqi Government to accord the new proposed Nineveh Plains Province an autonomous status (self-administrated region) to the Assyrians and other Christian minorities on the land of their ancestors in the north of Iraq (the territory located between the greater Zab and the river Tigris) and that the newly created Assyrian region in the said territory shall be administrated and protected by the Assyrians, under the jurisdiction of the central national Government.

2. That this House considers it will be absolutely necessary to the security and survival of the Assyrians in Iraq

and the establishment of such an Assyrian region as promulgated under article 121 of the Iraqi constitution will allow greater local Assyrian control within the context of their integrated, sovereign Iraqi state, and furthermore, such an Assyrian area would allow for political, educational, linguistic, religious, and cultural protection.

3. That this House calls on the Federal Government to use our seat in the United Nations Security Council to adopt a similar motion supporting a new province for the Assyrians in Iraq at this critical time before the next Iraq national election.

"I am very pleased all Members of the NSW Legislative Council (The Upper House) voted in support of my historical Assyrian Homeland Motion which I moved on behalf of the

"This Motion will also be a great encouragement to the Assyrian Christians in Iraq who are suffering persecution

"It is time for an historical Assyrian homeland to be re-established after so many centuries said Rev Nile

"I am very encouraged by the action of the current Government of Iraq to agree, in principle, to turn the area of Tuz, Fallujah and the Nineveh Plains into three new Provinces and the Cabinet will decide after the fulfilment of the necessary requirements."

REV FRED NILE IS PLEASED WITH SUCCESSFUL VOTE FOR THE PROVOCATION BILL

In his speech to the NSW Parliament on Tuesday 25 March 2014, Rev Nile stated:

CRIMESAMENDMENT(PROVOCATION) BILL 2014

Reverend the Hon. FRED NILE [6.43 p.m.], in reply: I thank all members for their contribution to this very important historic debate. In particular, I thank the members of the Legislative Council Select Committee on the Partial Defence of Provocation for their positive remarks about that committee, which I chaired. I am very pleased that so many members spoke to this bill. I thank the Hon. Trevor Khan, the Hon. Scot MacDonald, the Hon. David Clarke, the Hon. Dr Peter Phelps, Mr David Shoebridge, the Hon. Adam Searle, the Hon. Paul Green, Dr Mehreen Faruqi, the Hon. Helen Westwood and the Hon. Sophie Cotsis. As members know, The Greens, led by Mr

David Shoebridge, and the Opposition, led by the Hon. Adam Searle, have proposed some amendments, and the Hon. Dr Peter Phelps had some reservations about the legislation.

This bill makes an important amendment to the criminal law of this State in response to the recommendations of the Legislative Council Select Committee on the Partial Defence of Provocation. The bill reflects the hard work of that committee and the extensive consultation had with the community and criminal law experts. In order to raise the new partial defence of extreme provocation the deceased's conduct must amount to a serious indictable offence. In order to be satisfied that the accused has successfully raised the partial defence, the jury will first need to consider whether the accused lost self-control and then whether the provocative conduct was so

extreme that an ordinary person could have lost self-control so far as to have formed the intent to kill or cause really serious injury.

The provocative conduct may not occur immediately before the act causing death. Neither non-violent sexual advances nor self-induced provocation will provide grounds for raising the partial defence. In addition, self-induced intoxication can no longer be taken into account in any way. The amendments will ensure that the partial defence to murder may only be raised in appropriate circumstances in line with community expectations. I commend the bill to the House.

"I am very pleased that the Crimes Amendment (Provocation) Bill 2014 was finally passed by the NSW Legislative Council and will now be debated in the NSW legislative Assembly and become law in NSW" said Rev Fred Nile MLC.

The Hon. DUNCAN GAY: I thank the honourable member for his important question. I do not believe it is one for the Hon. Anthony Roberts but one for the Hon. Andrew Constance, who I also represent. I am prepared to have a go at most questions but this is one of a technical degree that I suspect is beyond my incredible competence. I will refer the question to the Minister and seek a detailed answer.

Rev Fred Nile Sounds Alarm Bells Concerning the Long-term Effects of Abortion

In his question to the NSW Parliament on Wednesday 5 March 2014, Mr Nile asked the following:

INDUCED ABORTION AND BREAST CANCER RISK

Reverend the Hon FRED NILE: My question without notice is to the Hon Michael Gallacher, representing the Minister for Health. Is the Government aware that recent peer-reviewed studies have found that a previous induced abortion is a risk equal to or greater than a family history of breast cancer? For example, is the Government aware of a study published in the *Indian Journal of Cancer* on 24 December last year

by Dr Bhadoria and others that compared 320 breast cancer patients with 320 carefully matched healthy women and found a 400 per cent increased breast cancer risk for women who had had earlier abortions? Is the Government also aware that of the 70 breast cancer studies undertaken worldwide since 1957, nearly 80 per cent have found that a previous induced abortion is a breast cancer risk? Will the Government take steps to ensure that New South Wales women and their doctors are informed about this risk?

The Hon MICHAEL GALLACHER: I will seek a detailed answer from the Minister for Health, as requested.

Death of Daniel Morcombe is Another Example of the Need for a Child Protection Register Listing all Child Sex Offenders

Daniel Morcombe's killer Brett Peter Cowan is a serial predator with an extensive history of sexually abusing children.

The 44-year-year told an inquest into Daniel's disappearance that by the time he turned 18 he had already preyed on up to 30 children. He said his offences stretched back to when he was about nine or 10 years of age.

However, Brett Peter Cowan was first convicted of a child sex offence in 1989 over the molestation of a seven-year-old boy in the public toilets of a Queensland playground. He also raped a 6 year old boy, who was a neighbour.

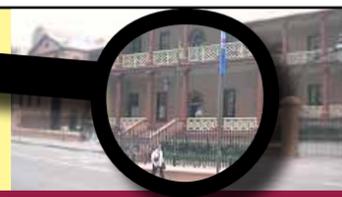
We applaud the persistence of the Morcombe family and the Police and Justice System to have brought Brett Cowan to justice and our continued sympathies to the Morcombe family and all the families who have suffered such great loss in similar devastating circumstances.

Child Protection (Nicole's Law) Bill

brought before the legislative Council in September 2009. The bill recognises the right of NSW families, concerned for the safety of their young children, to be made publicly aware of the presence of convicted paedophiles living within their neighbourhood. In light of the recidivism rates amongst paedophiles, legislators have an implicit responsibility to do all they can to ensure the safety and wellbeing of children.

The bill seeks to put the safety and protection of children before that of convicted sexual predators. It empowers parents and carers to take additional appropriate precautions when there is an increased localised risk to the children in their care.

The bill is named in memory of 5-year-old Nicole Hanns who was brutally stabbed 17 times by John Lewthwaite, a paedophile on parole.



High Court Rules Against Biology And Redefines Reality to Boot

HUMPTY DUMPTY: The question is: which is to be master – that's all.

If you thought the judicial activists were a brazen and reckless bunch, you ain't seen anything yet. There are no limits to the progressives on our court benches who think they can just make things up as they go along. Now they are even making rulings on biology, and in a new case, informing us that they can also trump reality.

We have just been informed by our enlightened justices that biology no longer exists, but is simply a social construct. I wish they would make a ruling that says activist judges don't exist, and then just disappear off the face of the earth. But we are not likely to be so fortunate.

Thus the social engineers in our courts will continue to rule against reality, common sense, and everything decent. And all this is thanks to the militant homosexual juggernaut which is destroying everything in its path. They are utterly smashing everything in their wake: marriage, family, sexuality, biology and even reality.

Not bad for a handful of activists and militants. And the lamestream media goes along with all this without a whimper. Such is the complete ruin of law, the media, and Western civilisation that we have even gone down this moonbat path.

Here then is the story, as one media outlet explains:

A Sydneysider has won a High Court case to be recognised as gender-neutral. Norrie, who was born male but underwent gender reassignment to become a woman, identifies neither as male or female and has taken legal action against NSW's

Registry of Births, Deaths and Marriages to be granted a non-specific certificate.

The court was asked to consider whether "non-specific" can be included as a third gender category under the Registry's Act. "The act recognises that a person may be neither male nor female, and so permits the registration of a person's sex as 'non specific'," read the High Court judgment, handed down on Wednesday. Norrie, who goes by one name, was famously granted a world-first non-specific status in 2010, but months later the NSW government revoked the classification.

The matter was challenged by both Norrie and the Registry until the latter took an appeal to the High Court. Lawyers for the Registry argued that unacceptable confusion would flow from the acceptance of more than two gender categories, and that the purpose of a reaffirmation procedure is to assist a person to be considered a member of the opposite sex.

Norrie stopped taking hormones after surgery, preferring to live as neither male nor female. Counsel for Norrie said it is the register's purpose to record the truth. "Norrie's sex remained ambiguous so that it would be to record misinformation in the register to classify her as male or female," a judgment summary reads. Sitting in Canberra on Wednesday, the bench unanimously found in favour of Norrie.

OK, makes perfect sense to me. In an age in which anything goes, I guess this is all very understandable. Biology is now simply a matter of judicial decree. There is no ultimate reality to anything, and the courts, in true Alice in Wonderland fashion, can redefine anything in any way they like.

Of course the lamestream media is running with the story big time, giving us the impression that this is just as normal and acceptable as a story about eating cereal or walking the dog. No gender? Sure, no probs. Why not? After all, biology does not exist anyway. We just make these things up to suit our fancies.

Even the media reports were full of stupidity and irony here. While covering all this with a straight face, they referred to this person as her. But this person is not a her. Nor a him. So what we have here is an 'it' at best. Indeed, it has insisted that it is neither male nor female, and it has managed to con these judicial jugheads and media moonbeams to buy all this gender bender insanity.

So the courts can now determine whether reality exists or not. Those are certainly some sweeping powers. Of course these activist judges have been playing God for quite some time now. So nothing all that surprising here. When men reject God, they foolishly and vainly think that they are God.

That is why they think they can ride roughshod over biology, sexuality, and even fundamental reality. It is about creating a Brave New World where anything and everything goes, with no ultimate truth, no fixed morality, and no boundaries or parameters whatsoever.

As G. K. Chesterton is said to have written, "When a man ceases to believe in God, he doesn't believe in nothing. He believes in anything." What was that about 'whom the gods would destroy, they first make crazy'?

Postscript: It must be noted that a very tiny percentage of people are in their own category, and are quite different from your run of the mill homosexuals, cross-dressers, transies, and so on. I refer to the intersex condition, where genetic abnormalities result in sexual confusion. There can be ambiguous genitalia, brought on by chromosomal imbalances – eg, having an extra sex chromosome – and so on. These can be found in conditions such as Congenital Adrenal Hyperplasia, Turner Syndrome, Klinefelter's Syndrome, and Androgen Insensitivity Syndrome. These very rare and difficult cases are not at all similar to the great majority of gender bender cases we see today, including this case.

Rev Fred Nile Congratulates the St Vincent de Paul Society for Their Caring Service for the Needy and Underprivileged

In his speech to the NSW Parliament on Thursday 27 March 2014, Rev Nile stated:

ST VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY

Reverend the Hon. FRED NILE [3.35 p.m.]: The St Vincent de Paul Society was founded by a 20-year-old student named Frederic Ozanam in 1833. It was established by like-minded individuals who wished to put their faith into action. This compassionate outlook, enthusiasm and vision continue today in Australia. Every day thousands of people share their time and energy, and care for humanity to make a difference in the lives of disadvantaged people all around Australia. Each and every day, the St Vincent de Paul Society in New South Wales helps people experiencing disadvantage through its 5,000 volunteer members and services. The society does this because it cannot see injustice and let it go unchallenged.

The St Vincent de Paul Society NSW provides compassionate and respectful support to the community's most vulnerable people, including those at risk of or experiencing homelessness. In the last financial year the St Vincent de Paul Society provided almost \$20 million worth of financial assistance to people experiencing disadvantage around New South Wales. In addition to this assistance, the St Vincent de Paul Society NSW manages 36 homeless and addiction services across the State that provide assistance to men, women and children. The society's homeless and addiction services across the State provided 274,145 bed nights and 692,785 meals in 2012-13. The St Vincent de Paul Society runs 98 services that aim to meet the demand of individuals and families in the communities in which they live.

Many of these services prevent people from falling into deeper crisis and include the provision of food, financial assistance, counselling, referral services, long-term subsidised housing, carers and holiday respite, care and assistance

centres, community services, and financial budgeting and loan programs. With approximately 250 Vinnies shops and a presence in most cities and towns in Australia, for many people Vinnies shops are the well-known and loved face of the St Vincent de Paul Society. In the last financial year, Vinnies shops provided close to \$2 million worth of assistance to people experiencing disadvantage at no cost. Last year close to 9,000 volunteers undertook more than 1.9 million hours of voluntary service at Vinnies shops.

The St Vincent de Paul Society assisted more than 470,000 people in New South Wales in 2012-2013 and will continue to do so by providing person-centred care to some of the most vulnerable people in society by respecting people's dignity, sharing hope and encouraging people to take control of their own destiny. One such person is Melissa, who turned to the St Vincent de Paul Society when she had no-one else to turn to. The society has helped Melissa in numerous ways over the years, including providing financial counselling, assistance with bills, advocacy, food and Christmas hampers, and even holiday respite for her family. More recently, Melissa has received help with back-to-school costs. These supplies mean that Melissa's children will not feel like they are different or worse off than other children at their school. Melissa says she does not know where she would be without the help of the St Vincent de Paul Society. She said:

I am so grateful and just hope that the support continues to be there for families like ours and for people who are in need

This is a further example through the St Vincent de Paul Society of the faith-based organisations in New South Wales that provide help outside that provided by governments and why it is important for the New South Wales and Federal governments to maintain this close working relationship with faith-based organisations in our State.

Churches Move to Save Christian Holidays

The NSW Council of Churches has expressed strong support for workers threatened with the erosion of restricted retail trading hours on public holidays. Council President, Rev Dr Ross Clifford, said the current restrictions on retail trading hours should be retained in NSW in order to support a healthy work-life balance for workers and their families. "We take the view that all persons are created equal, in the image of God, and must therefore be treated with dignity and respect, including in the workplace. A few days of designated public holidays out of 365 days in a year is not too great a burden for employers to carry in support of the common good," Dr Clifford said.

Christians affirm that work done should be justly remunerated; that workers have a right to adequate rest from their employment; and that a healthy work-life balance delivers measurable benefits to workers, their families, their employers and the whole community. Leaders from the Anglican, Catholic, Uniting and Baptist churches, and representatives of Wesley Mission and the Shop Distributive and Allied Employees Association, have signed an open letter to NSW Premier Barry O'Farrell, urging him to guarantee that retail trading hours will not be extended to include Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Anzac Day, Good Friday and Easter Sunday. "We appreciate the exemptions currently in place covering tourist areas and parts of the Sydney CBD – a sensible compromise. If people are desperate to shop they can avail themselves of these special trading areas on a public holiday. But if retail trading hours are deregulated for Boxing Day, employees will need to work on Christmas Day to prepare stores, and that is unacceptable," Dr Clifford said.

Rev Fred Nile remains committed to opposing plans to extend retail trading hours.

DARE TO IMAGINE

Imagine a day when the walls of your church are as wide as the boundaries of your community!

Imagine a day when your local government comes to your church for help!

Imagine a day that puts a smile on the faces of the poor and disadvantaged people in your community!

Imagine a day when the lonely find they have a friend!

Imagine a day when the body of Christ across our Nation comes together in one voice of thanks to God for the Nation we live in and the blessings we enjoy in this great Southland of the Holy Spirit!

The concept of a National Day of Thanksgiving has been in the hearts of many Australians for a number of years. Over the last decade many people have expressed a desire to see our nation, on one day each year, acknowledge

our Christian heritage and the lordship of Jesus Christ over our nation.

In 2003 the Australian Prayer Network took such thoughts and dreams to other national prayer, ministry, and church leaders. Overwhelming encouragement to pursue the concept was received. Out of these consultations was birthed our National Day of Thanksgiving. The Governor General embraced the idea and launched the concept at an official function at Government House on 11th February 2004. The Prime Minister and Leader of the Opposition then gave it their full support with statements encouraging all Australians to celebrate the Day. Christian television and radio embraced it, and have become promotional sponsors across Australia.

There needs however to be a vehicle through which the vision can be expressed, and we believe that vehicle must be the Christian Church. If the Church does not accept this role, then the National Day of Thanksgiving will be lost forever for our nation, as the ethos of the day cannot be picked up by any other group within the nation.

The preamble of Australia's constitution says, "Humbly relying on the blessings of Almighty God." National Day of Thanksgiving gives expression to these words found in our

constitution. Even the words of our national anthem, "Our land abounds in nature's gifts of beauty rich and rare," give inspiration for this day.

The National Day of Thanksgiving is meant to be shaped and run at a local level in communities across Australia. Local churches can give leadership, and can with the support of their community organise celebrations appropriate to their town, city or region. The National Day of Thanksgiving will therefore be expressed differently in each part of the Nation.

It is however also a day that can be picked up and celebrated by individuals who through the giving of cards, ribbons, or by doing an act of kindness to a friend or neighbour can be the vehicle of God's love and compassion to those around them.

REV FRED NILE URGES GOVERNMENT TO DETER HOMOSEXUAL YOUNG MEN FROM HIGH-RISK HOMOSEXUAL ACTIVITY

In answer to my question on 30 October 2013:

Reverend the Hon. FRED NILE: I wish to ask the Hon. Michael Gallacher, representing the Hon. Jillian Skinner, the Minister for Health, a question without notice. Is the Government aware that the Kirby Institute of the University of New South Wales has said that more than 1,250 people were newly diagnosed with HIV last year and that New South Wales led the way with a 24 per cent increase while Victoria was stable? Is the Government aware that a 10 per cent increase nationwide in new HIV cases last year has hit young people particularly hard, with hundreds of people in their twenties diagnosed? What is the Government's health initiative to combat this increase by deterring homosexual young men from high-risk sexual activity?

The Government has responded.

HIV PREVENTION

On 30 October 2013 Reverend the Hon.

Fred Nile asked the Minister for Police and Emergency Services, representing the Minister for Health, a question without notice about the increase in New South Wales in the number of people newly diagnosed with HIV. The Minister for Health provided the following response:

The Minister for Health and Medical Research has advised:

The New South Wales Government actively monitors HIV surveillance data in New South Wales. The number of new infections in men aged 20-29 years in 2012 was 120 in New South Wales and 315 nationally. This represents an increase of 30 notifications in New South Wales and 52 notifications nationally compared to 2011.

The New South Wales Government is the first government in Australia to adopt an HIV strategy with clear targets for

HIV prevention. The strategy prioritises prevention efforts to reach populations at greatest risk whilst refocusing efforts to drive down the number of new infections by increasing testing, treatment and safe sex practices. This includes a focus on young gay men to promote condom use and make it easier to have an HIV test.

Making testing for HIV easier will improve the frequency and regularity of HIV testing as well as increasing opportunities for risk reduction discussions. Recent initiatives include a "pop-up" rapid HIV testing site in Taylor Square, Sydney and the launch of a large "TEST MORE" campaign for World AIDS Day 2013.

The New South Wales Government funds the AIDS Council of NSW [ACON] as the leading community organisation which works to prevent HIV transmission in gay men and other

men who have sex with men. ACON in partnership with the Sydney Sexual Health Centre has recently established a community-based rapid HIV testing site called a[TEST] which has successfully attracted younger gay men and men who have never tested for HIV or not tested in the last 12 months.

A major HIV prevention initiative for gay men in 2013 is the Ending HIV campaign. Ending HIV aims to increase HIV testing and treatment, while strengthening condom use. More than 60 per cent of the men visiting the campaign website are aged 18 to 34 years. Additionally, the ACON Young Gay Men's Project has delivered a peer-led HIV prevention and sexual health program in New South Wales since 1989. During this time over 10,000 young men have participated in this program.

Rev Fred Nile Urges NSW Government to Procure Naval Ship Contracts

In his question to the NSW Parliament on Wednesday 26 March 2014, Mr Nile asked the following:

SHIPBUILDING INDUSTRY NEW SOUTH WALES

Reverend the Hon. FRED NILE: I ask the Hon. Michael Gallacher, representing the Hon. Brad Hazzard, MP, Minister for Planning and Infrastructure, a question without notice. Is the Government aware of the Federal Government's recent defence white paper that recommends that the current naval fleet be replaced with 48 new vessels and that the cost of construction is estimated at around \$100 billion over the next 25 to 30 years? The cost of maintenance and technology upgrades will cost in the vicinity of \$150 billion over the life of the fleet. Is the Government also aware that an investment of this magnitude is critical to secure

the infrastructure and skills we need to create jobs, apprenticeships and engineering opportunities for the State as a whole and the shipbuilding industry in particular? Will the Minister inform the House of the plans of the New South Wales Government to procure contracts, which would be an enormous boost to the local economy in terms of skilled jobs, industry capability and innovation?

The Hon. MICHAEL GALLACHER: There can be no doubt that there are great opportunities for the nation in relation to investment in our defence force, not just in the equipment but in the land and all the available resources. It is a serious question deserving of a serious answer. I will refer the question to the Minister for Planning and Infrastructure, as requested.

REV FRED NILE CALLS FOR CLOSED-CIRCUIT TV IN KINGS CROSS

In answer to my question on 26 November 2013:

Reverend the Hon. FRED NILE: I ask the Hon. Michael Gallacher, Minister for Police and Emergency Services, a question without notice. Given the recent rape of a young female Belgian backpacker in the Potts Point-King Cross area, can the Minister inform the House whether the NSW Police Force has any initiatives to continue the installation of closed-circuit television cameras to assist in resolving crime in known hotspots such as 90 Victoria Street and other initiatives such as providing improved street lighting by Ausgrid in this dark and dangerous area?

The Government has responded.

KINGS CROSS CRIME PREVENTION

On 26 November 2013 Reverend the Hon. Fred Nile asked the Minister for Police and Emergency Services a question without notice about the use of closed-

circuit television cameras in known crime hotspots. The Minister for Police and Emergency Services provided the following response:

The NSW Police Force has advised me:

The NSW Police Force is not responsible for the introduction, operation or monitoring of closed-circuit television cameras. Closed-circuit television facilities are generally installed and maintained by local government authorities.

The NSW Police Force has confirmed the installation of closed-circuit television in the Potts Point/Kings Cross area is the responsibility of the City of Sydney Council. The City of Sydney Council has installed closed-circuit television cameras at the corner of Darlinghurst Road and Victoria Street in Kings Cross, providing coverage of that part of the street.

City of Sydney Council is best placed to provide further detail on these issues.

CRIMES AMENDMENT (ZOE'S LAW) BILL 2013 (NO. 2)

On Thursday 29 August 2013 Chris Spence MP introduced Crimes Amendment (Zoe's Law) Bill 2013 (No. 2) into the lower house with changes to Rev Nile's original Bill. We thank God that this historic Bill was passed by the NSW Legislative Assembly by an overwhelming vote of 63 to 26, which was remarkable.

We expected the Zoe's Bill to be debated and passed by the NSW Legislative Council during May but we have encountered fierce opposition by the pro-abortion feminists comprising the "Sisterhood".

However, the Zoe's Bill has clear exemptions for any medical procedure including abortion. The Zoe's Bill also requires the mother to agree to any legal action. Normally no woman would sue the doctor who performed her abortion so it does not affect abortions.


